## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Border-Crossing and3 Re-entry for K9s Act".

## 4 SEC. 2. IMPORTATION OF LIVE DOGS.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health 6 7 and Human Services, acting through the Director of the 8 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, (in this section referred to as the "Secretary") shall revise part 71 9 of title 42, Code of Federal Regulations, so that an im-10 11 porter shall be allowed to import a dog into the United States, through any port of entry, without rabies vaccina-12 13 tion documentation or a CDC dog import form (as defined in part 71.51(a) of such title 42) if— 14

- (1) the dog has not been in a country at high
  risk (as defined by the Secretary) for dog-maintained rabies virus variant—
- 18 (A) in the case that of a dog that is older
  19 than 6 months of age, for a period that equals
  20 or exceeds 180 days prior to the date on which
  21 the importer seeks to import the dog; or

(B) in the case of a dog that is not older than 6 months of age, for the period beginning on the date of birth of the dog and ending on the date on which the importer seeks to import such dog; and

(2) the importer provides written or verbal con firmation that the dog meets the requirements of
 subparagraph (A).

4 (b) IMPORTER.—In this Act, the term "importer"
5 means any person who transports or causes the transpor6 tation of a dog into the United States from a foreign coun7 try.
